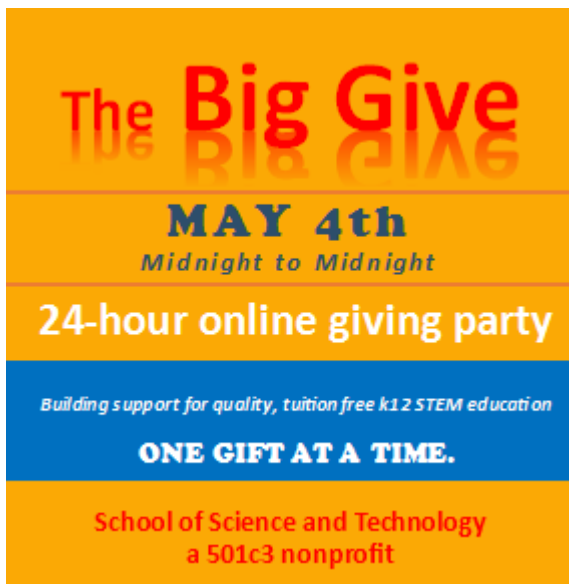




May 4th is a big day at SS-Campus. What do you think is happening?

The Statue of Liberty is a beloved symbol of freedom and diversity. There's also a connection to generosity that many may not know—and it's a message for all those who value the School of Science and Technology.

Here's more about generosity in the United States. Though the French gave the Statue to the United States. There was no funding for the pedestal. Who would fund it? It was built through the gifts of individuals. Some refer to it as America's crowdfunding pioneer effort. The campaign eventually raised money from more than 160,000 donors, including young children, businessmen, street cleaners and politicians, with more than three-quarters of the donations amounting to less than a dollar.

As our SST family begins our first BIG GIVE, it's important to remember that most funds do not come from foundations or corporations, Most support of nonprofits (75%) comes from individuals. At SST we say that no gift is too small--and the Statue of Liberty is a great example of how small donations create big results. Together there is nothing we cannot achieve.
